

TRANSATLANTIC CRUISES...Are they for you?? By Lori Fritzy



Transatlantic cruises are unique and can be a great value. Cruise lines need to reposition their ships from the Caribbean to Europe in spring, and back to the Caribbean in fall. The prices are lowered so that the ship produces revenue for the repositioning. Also, the fact that there are usually very few ports of call means fewer costly port charges. The ports that are included,

however, are very interesting. Given the length and itinerary of repositioning cruises, the demographic is basically seasoned travelers, usually older than on shorter cruises, and very few children (unless you go over a holiday break).

There will be about 6-8 or more sea days in a row on a transatlantic cruise. All the cruise lines make sure there are enough activities to fill your days (when you are not eating or relaxing!). Each cruise line has its own personality, and that is reflected somewhat in the activities offered. But there will always be the usual trivia, pool games (covered climate-controlled pools in most cases), enrichment talks, casino, sauna, spa, gym, salon,



dancing/fitness classes, movies, shopping, etc., etc., etc. It is a good idea to research the character of the cruise line when making your selection. Whichever cruise you pick, it is a great way to unplug and unwind. Explore...get to know and enjoy the ship, staff and fellow passengers; it's something we rarely have the opportunity to do when there are ports to visit almost every day.

Entertainment is very good, but may not be as opulent as on a shorter cruise with more ports. On shorter cruises, where there are stops with airports, it is easy to rotate entertainers on and off the ships, but that does not work quite as well in the middle of the Atlantic ocean. All the lines do an excellent job of entertaining their guests, though. Along with the shows and other music and dancing venues, there are the "special nights" and parties that are always a great time.



There are several included dining venues on any ship you sail; usually a main dining room, a large international buffet and several casual dining spots. In addition to the included dining, most ships offer specialty dining venues at an additional cost. On a longer transatlantic cruise, it is worth trying at least one of them for a different experience, although the ships do a good job of varying their menus.

Check out your selected cruise's "all inclusive" packages; they may or may not be right for you. Items you would pay extra for, like drinks, wifi (which is sometimes spotty in the middle of the ocean), specialty dining, shore excursions, etc. are bundled together for one price. If you are going to take advantage of all of these extras, figure out what you would spend purchasing everything separately to see if the bundle is worth it for you.

Something to take into consideration is that the weather during spring and fall can be quite chilly, sometimes with rough seas, which could cause the ship to miss one or more ports of call. It is not always the case, though; and there are medications available, as well as ginger chews and tea for sea sickness. Unfortunately, we can't predict the weather; it's a toss of the dice.

Give it some thought; you may be sailing across the Atlantic to exotic ports soon!
