## PACKING TIPS FOR A ROAD TRIP

with frequent stops along the way

#### Pack Essentials in Easy-to-Reach Places

 Load non-essential items, such as luggage or bulky items, in the trunk or back seat.



 Place frequently used items like snacks, water, and entertainment in easy-toreach locations, like the center console or glove compartment.

#### **Use Soft-Sided Bags and Backpacks**

 Instead of structured suitcases, use soft-sided bags and backpacks to maximize trunk space and reduce clutter.

**Consider packing a small overnight bag with essentials**, like a change of clothes, toiletries, and medications, for each person.

#### Keep Perishable Items Cool and Secure

- Use a cooler with ice packs to keep perishable items, like sandwiches and snacks, fresh and safe.
- Pack liquids in leak-proof containers to avoid spills and messes.

- o Pack Snacks and Water
- Bring a variety of healthy snacks, such as nuts, granola bars, and fruit, to keep everyone satisfied during stops.
- Don't forget reusable water bottles and refill them at rest stops or restaurants



#### **Plan for Frequent Breaks**

 Research rest stops and attractions along your route to plan for regular breaks.

**Consider packing a portable charger** for devices and a **first-aid kit** with essentials like pain relievers and band-aids.

## Traveling with Scottie... Memories of Callaway Gardens

Just recently my husband and I joined several other SC Travel Club members and others on a fabulous 2-day trip to Warm Springs and Pine Mountain,

Georgia. On the 5-hr. trip there Scottie treated us to a DVD about FDR and Warm Springs as we neared our first stop, a visit to **FDR's Little White House**. There we learned more about our inspiring 32nd President, Franklin Delano Roosevelt and his wife Eleanor. His love and respect of all



people, both the poor, the downtrodden and the wealthy, led him to be responsible for a series of programs and projects known as the New Deal, which aimed to help the United States recover from the Great Depression, such as the Social Security and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC), created to restore trust in the banking system, insuring deposits in banks to prevent bank failure.


It was awe-inspiring to see the place FDR loved best and where he died suddenly while posing for a presidential portrait in his 63rd year from a cerebral hemorrhage. (The unfinished portrait is displayed in the museum which contains many artifacts and mementos of FDR's years there in Warm Springs. The artist, several years later, redid the portrait in its entirety from her memories of the hours spent with the late president.)

After leaving there and heading towards our final destination, Pine Mountain, and the Calloway Gardens Resort, we stopped for lunch at Peachtree Farm; a chance to stock up on some yummy "peachy" treats, too.



**Calloway Gardens** offers a variety of activities and attractions throughout the year, making it a great destination. Some of the many attractions include 2,500 acres of stunning gardens, including the vibrant azalea blossoms in spring. There are also numerous hiking and biking trails.

It also features **Robin Lake Beach**, a large lake with white sand beaches -- perfect for summer relaxation and water sports, but not, alas, when we were there in mid-November. It did provide, however, some very picturesque views of the surrounding woods and mountains. Plus it was the setting for what we had come to see... the **Festival of Lights**, enchanting visitors for over 30 years, with over 8 million lights and holiday scenes lit up and animated with music. We took the open-aired *Jolley Trolley* to view the displays with a lively commentary accompanying us.





The following day before we took our leave

from the resort, we visited the **Day Butterfly Center**, right on the resort grounds. This tropical conservatory is home to over 1,000 butterflies representing more than 50 different species. The glass-enclosed environment filled with tropical plants provides a lush habitat for the butterflies. Visitors stroll through the conservatory and observe butterflies up close as they flutter among the vibrant flowers and foliage.

Following that we also visited the on-site **Discovery Center**,

learning all about birds of prey at the lakeside presentation, even having an opportunity to see a couple of the ambassador birds they presented. We had a chance to visit the rest of the nature displays in the Discovery Center and grab some lunch for the return home.

If you've never been on one of Scottie's bus trips, it's a fabulous time, both educational and entertaining. Her destination trips are not to be missed, filled with outof-the-way experiences on the way to the main event. And Scottie knows where all the good eating spots are, too. 

# WHERE TO NEXT?

## LAS VEGAS...IT'S MORE THAN JUST GAMBLING! (PART 2)

The areas surrounding Las Vegas offer spectacular beauty. Amazing natural wonders are just a day trip away, either by organized tour or car rental. Following are some ideas for tours, but all can be done on your own....



Within the Navajo Tribal Park are **Antelope Canyon**, one of the most photographed spots in the U.S. and **Horseshoe Bend**, where the Colorado River created a 1,000 foot deep horseshoe bend in Glen Canyon. Full day tours including admissions and plenty of time to explore are available to these attractions.

Visit the South Rim of the **Grand Canyon** on a full day bus tour (approximately 15 hours). Tour operators pick up from most major hotels. Entertaining and informative commentary is given on the bus by knowledgeable guides. Tours can include lunch, snacks and time to explore on your own.



Join a half day VIP tour with early access to **Hoover Dam**. In addition to transportation in small, climate controlled vehicles, Tours include the Powerplant inside the Dam, stunning views from the Memorial Bridge, admission to Visitor's Center exhibits and Observation Deck and 45 minute Walk on the Top Tour of the Dam Learn about the construction and operation of the Dam from expert Guides. Prefer to "do it on your own"? Rent a car and add Historic Boulder City to your excursion.

On a 7-hour tour, you can experience the surreal landscapes of both **Bryce Canyon**, with its spires and hoodoos, and **Zion**, with its towering canyon walls. Each are so different from one another, and so beautiful in their own right.



Ready to escape the the glitz and big splashy shows? **Death** Valley Sunset and Stargazing tour is a journey into the serene beauty of Death Valley National Park. Small tours explore iconic

spots like Furnace Creek, Badwater Basin, and Dante's View. There is nothing quite like a desert sunset followed by stargazing in one of the world's best Dark Sky Parks. Of course, day trips are also available to Death Valley National Park.



You can see the **Valley of Fire and Mojave Desert** on a 6-hour tour of the largest state park in Nevada. Enjoy the unusual landscape shapes and vibrant colors.

Leave behind the hectic pace of Las Vegas to explore the desert topography of **Red Rock Canyon** National Conservation area, with its friendly Park Rangers and informative visitor's Center. There is a marked scenic drive, and If you are lucky you will catch a glance of the protected wild burros and horses that call the area home.



Lake Mead was formed by the Hoover Dam on the Colorado River. At only 24 miles east of Las Vegas, it is possible to enjoy a boat ride on the largest man-made reservoir in the US as part of your visit, if the water levels allow it. Due to drought and usage, water levels have been dropping yearly. Don't forget the scenic views of the jagged mountain ranges that surround the lake, especially at sunset.

A full day (a long day!) tour of **Los Angeles/Hollywood** area might be for you. Transportation and extensive sightseeing are included.

How about a **wine-tasting tour** of Pahrump, Nevada, an hour from Las Vegas. From mead and cider to zinfandels, this is a prime area for wineries; there is even a rum-producing distillery. Tours are offered, but you can certainly go on your own. There are many family owned wineries set amongst beautiful, majestic backdrops.

There are also **helicopter tours**, **hot air balloon rides** and countless other attractions outside the city that are accessible as a day trip.

The Travel Club is not just for long trips every once in a while. The **WEGO special interest group has something to do all year round!** Attend a WEGO meeting to hear about local events, showcasing a diverse range of experiences, including classical performances, festivals, parades, home tours, home and garden tours, concerts, plays, shows, markets, art exhibitions, lectures, lunch with author series, museum exhibits and events, local tours, and many other places to go and things to do. Discover a variety of options – most events are moderately priced and numerous offerings are free.

The **WEGO list** is in two parts. The *monthly list* includes events for specific dates. The *Ongoing Happenings* list contains information about events that occur every month, rather than repeating them all the time. Keep it handy to supplement the monthly lists. Special activities for anything on the ongoing list will be included on the monthly list. Click on the links provided on both lists for more information about the activities and to purchase tickets or register. Since an additional fee is often charged for online tickets, consider calling the phone number given to save some money.

The WEGO lists are emailed to club members and posted on the club's webpage in the middle of the prior month. These lists are for your information to go on your own. The meetings and Facebook page provide an opportunity to get together and arrange to go places with others. The Facebook page also provides last-minute updates and a way to keep in touch with other Travel Club members.

The *December list* includes classical concerts, ballets (including several *Nutcracker* performances), many holiday festivals (parades, lights, shopping, etc.), contemporary concerts, holiday and other plays, comedy and variety shows (*A Christmas Tradition* is a favorite), musicals, The Journey and a live Nativity Christmas events, a cabaret-style supper club, markets and boutiques, *Wreaths Across America*, art exhibitions, Palmetto Bluff Conservancy activities, Savannah River holiday cruises, races, a wine tasting, lectures, Nativity displays, sporting events, model train display, car shows, author talks, evening lantern tours at *Fort Pulaski* and *Wormsloe*, a polar bear swim, special activities at several museums, and much more!
